This adaptation of William Shakespeare's comedic tale of love, accompanied by modified renditions of Mendelssohn's score, will be slightly darker than most—"more in



the style of Tim Burton," according to director Simon Moody, a sophomore—but will retain the Bard's original cast of fairies, nobles and "rude mechanicals" in ancient Athens and the surrounding forest. Produced by seniors Maggi Singleton and Kat Williams, the cast features Marlboro students and recent graduates, including Ann Sammis '06 as Titania and Hippolyta, Ieremiah Francyck as Theus and Oberon and Dan Phelan as Puck. Costumes, designed by Singleton, blend Greek, Mesopotamian and Byzantine designs in keeping with the play's vision of ancient Greece, and the set, designed by Jayml Mistry, contrasts the cagelike atomosphere of the city with the freedom found in the wild and alien forest. "I'm trying to emphasize Shakespeare's commentary on love," Moody explains, "it's ridiculous, unpredictable, immature and painful, but we can't live without it."

Robert Merfeld, piano, and Bayla Keyes, violin, continue the Mozart (& more) at Marlboro concert series. They will be joined by young violinist Metok Hughes-Levine, who will perform movements from Mozart's Six variations in G minor and the Sonata in C major. Keyes and Merfeld will also perform movements from Sonatas in F major, K.30; A major, K. 305; D major, K. 306 and B flat major, K. 454. Pianist Robert Merfeld was a founding member of Apple Hill Chamber Players with whom he toured for more than 20 years. He has performed internationally as a soloist, in festivals and with orchestras and chamber music ensembles and is on the faculties of Boston and Harvard universities and the Longy School of Music. Bayla Keyes is a founding member of the Muir String Quartet. She performs widely as a soloist, chamber musician and as a member of Boston Musica, Viva and Sonos. She teaches at Boston University College of Fine Arts and is the artistic director of the Interlochen Chamber Music Conference. The final concert in this series will be performed on February 11, 2007 with 8 year-old guest violinist Meredith Hiller. Seating in the Serkin Center is limited and is on a first come, first served basis.
