**BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH:**

Howard C. Rice, Jr. (1904-1980) was a translator of historical works and the director of the department of rare books and special collections at the Princeton University Library from 1948 until he retired in 1970. Dr. Rice was also a specialist on the American Revolution. He was a graduate of Dartmouth College and the University of Paris and taught American history at Phillips Academy in Andover, Massachusetts, and French at Harvard University. At Princeton's library, he held the rank of associate professor.

Howard C. Rice, Jr. was also a Rudyard Kipling scholar, dedicating much of his life to researching and collecting materials on the four years Rudyard Kipling and his family lived in Vermont (1892-1896). He wrote several books, one of which is entitled *Rudyard Kipling in New England*. Howard C. Rice, Jr. died in Brattleboro, Vermont, in 1980.

**SCOPE AND CONTENTS NOTE:**

The Howard C. Rice, Jr. (HCR) Collection was given as a gift to the Rice Library at Marlboro College in 1981 by Mrs. Howard C. Rice, Jr. The Collection was processed with funding, in part, from the Gladys Kriebel Delmas Foundation. The focus of the HCR Collection is Rudyard Kipling (RK) and his life in Brattleboro, Vermont, during the years 1892-1896, with some materials dating after 1896. In addition, the Collection includes some of HCR's personal papers, including books, articles, and manuscript drafts he wrote during his lifetime. While the materials are dated 1892 through 1980, the majority of them date from 1950 to 1974.

The HCR Collection is arranged into 6 Series, as follows: I. HCR Correspondence; II. Kipling Research Materials; III. HCR Publications; IV. HCR Woodcuts; V. Exhibition Catalogs; VI. Auction and Rare Book Catalogs. There are also several subseries within each series. The arrangement of the Collection reflects the original order in which HCR organized his material, which seems to be mostly by subject and type. The only exception to this is the alphabetical arrangement of Series IV, V, and VI which was done during processing. There are some oversize materials in the Collection; they are noted in the individual descriptions. The physical condition of the materials in the Collection is very good.

The HCR Collection contains many photographs. Folders containing photographs have been identified as such with the notation "includes photographs" in the individual descriptions. In most cases, the folder description gives an indication of the subject matter of the photographs. All of the images in the Collection have been sleeved in mylar for protection.

The strength of this Collection lies in its size and diversity. Some highlights of the Collection include:

- Series I. *The HCR Correspondence Series* contains letters between HCR and Mrs. Baimbridge (Elsie Kipling), and letters between HCR and Dorothy Canfield Fisher. There are also scores of other letters to and from HCR regarding information on RK, his residence (Naulakha) in Vermont and his publications and family life. In addition, there are many photographs within this series. For the most part, the photographs in the Collection are copies of original photos held by the Landmark Trust in the Frederick Cabot Holbrook Collection. Boxes 6 and 7 contain the majority of the photographs of RK, his family, and the Balestier family.

- Series II. *The Kipling Research Materials Series* contains original RK letters dating from the time when he and his family lived in Vermont. The letters are not literary in nature. Also included are typed and handwritten transcriptions of letters between Grace Cabot Holbrook (GCH) and Mary Rogers Cabot (MRC). The bulk of this series consists of HCR's research notes which in their original form before processing were housed in 23 notebook binders. Lastly, the series includes numerous books and articles about and by RK.

●Series III. *The HCR Publications Series* is a collection of published and unpublished material on the subject of RK. There are a few items included that are not RK related.

●Series IV. *The HCR Woodcuts Series* contains bookplates and woodcuts used in Rice's publications.

●Series V and VI. These two series contain exhibition, auction, and rare book catalogs that include RK works.

Additional information related to Rudyard Kipling can be found in the Rudyard Kipling Papers (MS1) in the Rice Library. A nearly complete set of English and American first editions of Kipling's published works can be found in the Guernsey Collection, also housed at the Rice Library.
